UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

S. 2873

1.—Ordered, That on Tuesday, November 29, 2016, the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions be discharged from further consideration of and the Senate proceed to the immediate consideration of S. 2873, the ECHO Act; provided, that Amdt. No. 5110, offered by the Senator from Tennessee (Mr. Alexander), be agreed to; provided further, that there be up to 30 minutes of debate, equally divided in the usual form; further, that following the use or yielding back of time, the bill be read a third time and the Senate vote on passage of S. 2873, as amended, with no intervening action or debate. (Nov. 17, 2016.)

H.R. 2578 (ORDER NO. 120)

2.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on Amdt. No. 4787, offered by the Senator from Kentucky (Mr. McConnell) for the Senator from Arizona (Mr. McCain), to H.R. 2578, an Act making appropriations for the Departments of Commerce and Justice, Science, and Related Agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum under Rule XXII be waived; provided further, that the filing deadline under Rule XXII be at 2:30 p.m. on Tuesday. (June 20, 2016.)

H.R. 2685 (ORDER NO. 118)

3.—Ordered, That with respect to the cloture motion on the motion to proceed to H.R. 2685, an act making appropriations for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum under Rule XXII be waived. (Nov. 3, 2015.)

S. 1881 (ORDER NO. 169)

4.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 1881, a bill to prohibit Federal funding of Planned Parenthood Federation of America, the mandatory quorum under Rule XXII be waived. (Aug. 3, 2015.)

S. 1357 (ORDER NO. 86)

5.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 1357, a bill to extend authority relating to roving surveillance, access to business records, and individual terrorists as agents of foreign powers under the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 until July 31, 2015, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum under Rule XXII be waived. (May 23, 2015.)

S. 534 (ORDER NO. 22)

6.—Ordered, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 534, a bill to prohibit funds from being used to carry out certain Executive actions related to immigration, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (Feb. 27, 2015.)
